



Language Barriers for Bilingual Students: Literature Review

- Is mathematics really a universal language?
 - Test results relate to language competency [1]
- The English language homophones, homonyms, ...
- Students computing in their native language
- Wordy maths questions
- Terms associated with basic mathematics cause difficulty
 - Familiarity with everyday language may not be enough with regards to mathematical terms



Language Barriers for All Students

- Abbreviations
- Latin/Greek/other
- Notation
- Homonyms, synonyms, ...



Resource Development


1. Glossary of mathematical words and phrases

2. Bilingual dictionary

- Online version of both
- Website which will update over time with crowdsourced translations

1. Glossary

- Separate list of unfamiliar/technical phrases and acronyms
- Definitions also included
- Examples where appropriate



Unfamiliar Phrases & Acronyms

Students coming into HE may not have seen or used unfamiliar phrases appropriately.

Lemma - a subsidiary or intermediate theorem in an argument or proof

Reductio ad absurdum - reduction to absurdity (proof by contradiction)

e.g. - exempli gratia w.l.o.g - without loss of generality



2. Bilingual Dictionary

- First version of the bilingual dictionary is in Welsh
- Organised by area of mathematics
- Physical dictionary will be alphabetised in English
- Feedback from first year students with a Welsh-speaking background



General mathematical vocabulary



Phrase	Definition
a priori	A fact is known 'a priori' if it is evident from logic alone, without need of evidence.
ad hoc	For this purpose
ad infinitum	To infinity, usually referring to a never ending process.
Ansatz	An educated guess that is not rigourously backed up.


