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- Project started around 5 years ago
- A web-based resource that includes a growing range of statistics resources
- Aimed at HE (and post 16) T&L in Statistics
- In 12 months to (June 2014) had over 12,000 users view over 60,000 pages
  - 50% from the UK
- Want to develop and expand range of resources:

# Statstutor Community Project

## What is it?

- See [www.statstutor.ac.uk/communities](http://www.statstutor.ac.uk/communities)
- Mechanism to contribute **peer reviewed** resources to **statstutor**
- Submitted under a creative commons (share and share alike) Licence
- All original “source files” from resources submitted via the statstutor community project are listed on statstutor
- Allows users to use existing resources “as-is” or to modify them to meet their own students’ needs

# Statstutor Community Project

## How do I contribute?

- Find a colleague (ideally!) at another UK HE institution willing to review your resources
- Download the templates and instructions from [www.statstutor.ac.uk/communities](http://www.statstutor.ac.uk/communities)
  - Templates for both Word and LaTeX
  - Excel **metadata** template; author's details and keywords to enable resource to be searched for
  - Can provide other templates (e.g. for Powerpoint or video based resources on request)

## How do I contribute?

- Once completed (and reviewed) email your resource(s) to:

- Include as attachments:
  - Your resource!
  - Completed Excel metadata template
  - Plus all source files where applicable
    - e.g. Completed LaTeX template & all diagrams

# Statstutor Community Project FAQs

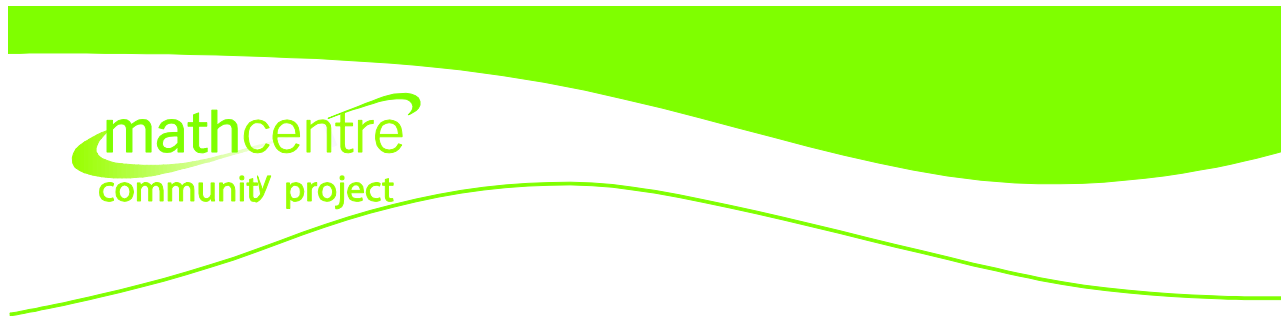
- Who owns the copyright?
  - The author (this is stated on the template)
- What does the reviewer check for?
  - Academic integrity, grammer(!) and typo errors ect(!)
- How long should the resources be?
  - See existing resources as a guide. Quick reference leaflets need to be no more than 2 sides of A4
- What if my resource is not a leaflet or a video?
  - Talk to Janette/Alun about various flexible options for hosting your resources

# What Topics Are Needed?

- Topics are restricted to statistics topics
