In 2016, the **sigma** Network made the transition from a HEFCE-funded project to a professional association for those working in, or with a professional interest in, mathematics and statistics support in higher education.

## **Data Protection Statement**

## Collecting and storing your personal data (2018 Data Protection Act and General Data Protection Regulation Compliant)

What is personal data?

Personal data is defined as "any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ('Data Subject')".

## What data does the sigma Network use?

We will collect your name, institution (if any), job title (if any) and a contact email address.

Why does the sigma Network need this data?

According to the constitution of the **sigma** Network as a professional association, it is required to have a specifically recorded membership. This membership has the right to take part in deciding the direction of the organisation, for example through voting for the Steering Group and on any additional matters required by the constitution to be approved by members. Voting takes place annually at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). All members will be invited to attend the AGM. The **sigma** Network will not release your membership data to any third party without your consent.

Where will the sigma Network store your data?

Your data will be stored on a username and password protected server at the University of Bath. The electronic database will be accessible only to the Membership Officer and Steering Group of the **sigma** Network

How long will the sigma Network keep your information?

The membership database will be reviewed annually when invitations are sent out to the AGM and members not responding for 3 years will be removed from the database. If you wish to be removed from the database, you may request this at any time.

What are your rights?

You may request at any time to see the information we hold on you, and have it corrected or deleted by contacting <u>mash-sigma@bath.ac.uk</u>. If you wish to raise a complaint on the handling of your data, please contact the Data Protection Officer at the University of Bath (email <u>dataprotection-queries@bath.ac.uk</u>), who will investigate the matter.

If you are not satisfied with our response, or believe we are processing your data not in accordance with the law, you can escalate to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO).
