Dear Delegate,

Welcome to Dublin City University! Many thanks for attending the conference.

Conference Venue

Dublin City University, Glasnevin, Dublin 9.

The conference is based primarily in the Nursing (H) Building, near the Collins Avenue entrance to the campus. Registration and lunch will take place in the Lonsdale (X) Science Building.

There are a number of facilities on-campus, such as ATMs, a Pharmacy, a Londis shop.

Registration

Please follow signs (or see attached map) to the Lonsdale (X) Science Building. Registration will take place between 9:30am – 10:30am on Thursday, 5th September and from 8:30am – 9:00am on Friday, 6th September.

Programme

Conference Dinner

This will take place on-campus in the 1838 Club. There will be a wine reception from 18:30, and delegates are asked to be seated for dinner by 19:15.

On-campus Accommodation

There are two locations being used for on-campus accommodation, so to avoid confusion, separate instructions have been sent via email to those delegates who opted to stay on-campus.

WiFi on Campus

There are two wifi networks available. You can use the unsecured DCU-Guest-Wifi or use your home institution login details to access Eduroam across campus. Check [DCU ISS services help page](#) for instructions on configuring Eduroam on your device.

Information for Presenters

Oral Presentations: These will be part of a chaired session of three talks. Each presentation should last 15 minutes to allow 5 minutes for questions and discussions. There will be a 5-minute movement break after each oral presentation, to allow delegates to move between rooms, and maximise the number of talks of interest that each delegate can attend.

Workshops: These will be up to an hour long, and will not be chaired.

Lightning Talks: These will be 3 minutes long. Please do not exceed this time limit. There are ducks at stake.

Please try to send your talk in advance to eabhna.nifhloinn@dcu.ie, or ensure that you upload your talk onto the conference laptop in the relevant room by the break before your session.

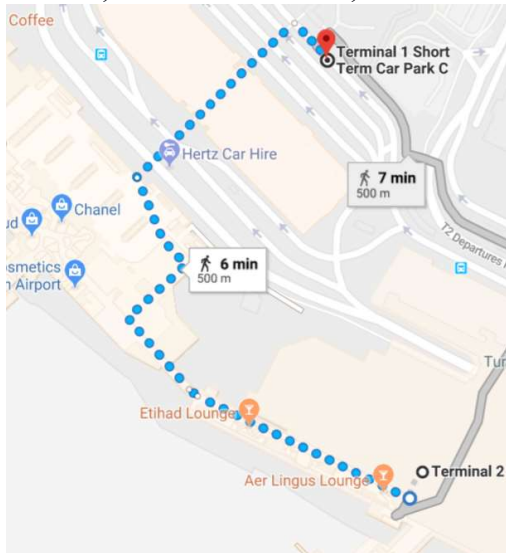
Travel Information to DCU, Glasnevin Campus

By Air (Dublin Airport)

[Dublin Airport](#) is one of Europe's busiest airports, with more than 55 airlines flying to over 190 destinations. The airport is 7.7km from the conference venue at St. Patrick's Campus, DCU. A taxi for this journey will cost €12-€16.

Two [Dublin Bus](#) routes serve Dublin Airport and stop approximately 10 mins from Glasnevin campus, DCU. The 16 (towards Ballinteer) and the 41 (towards Abbey street) stop outside the Terminal 1 short term car park. The cash fare is €3 which must be paid exactly, in coins only, to the bus driver (no notes will be accepted, and no change given.) Alight at stop 213 (Swords Road, Iveragh Road) and walk directly down Collins avenue towards DCU.

To find the bus stop from Terminal 1, walk straight out of the arrivals hall, cross the road and walk through the next building to the bus stands. The relevant stop is on your right. From terminal 2 arrivals, head to terminal 1, then follow the directions below.



By Sea (Dublin Port)

Dublin is also accessible by sea from Britain and France. The major ferry companies are [Irish Ferries](#) and [StenaLine](#). Further information on sailings are available on their websites. Dublin Port is 4.9km from the conference venue at Glasnevin Campus, DCU by taxi at a cost of €12-€16.

By Rail (Heuston, Connolly and Drumcondra Stations)

You can plan your journey with [Irish Rail](#). The closest railway station to the venue is Drumcondra on the Maynooth/Longford/Sligo line which is just one stop from Connolly station. Exit Drumcondra station and take the 11 or 13 bus from the stop just outside the station. The cash fare is €3 which must be paid exactly, in coins only, to the bus driver (no notes will be accepted, and no change given.)

Those arriving in Heuston station should exit the station and turn right. Follow the luas line up to James's street where the 13 (towards Harristown) will bring you to Glasnevin campus, DCU at a cost of €3 (coins only, paid to the driver.)

Travel throughout the City with Leap Card

You can avail of cheaper bus/luas fares and daily caps by purchasing a leap card. These cost €5 and can be purchased and topped up in most shops in Dublin city centre.

If you intend to travel a lot during your visit you can avail of daily caps on a [leap visitor card](#): €10 for one day, €19.50 for two days. These can be purchased online or at the airport on your arrival.

Note: If you are travelling on buses without a Leap Card, you must have exact change in coins – no notes are accepted and no change is given.

Useful Apps

- Dublin Bus – allows you to search by stop number, route, address or find stops nearby for Dublin bus routes around Dublin
- Free Now – allows you to order a taxi and pay for it by credit card
- Real Time Ireland – provides real-time information for Dublin Bus, Go-Ahead Ireland, Bus Eireann, DART, Rail and Luas
- Journey Planner – provides real-time route planning for transport in Ireland, including timetables and maps
- Met Eireann – national weather forecasting app
