

Annual General Meeting 2020

MINUTES

Due to the current Coronavirus pandemic, this was a virtual AGM.

The 160 Individual Members of the **sigma** Network (registered as at end July 2020) were invited to receive the Chair's Report, ratify Steering Group Membership for 2020/21, and provide feedback via an online portal during the 4 week period up to **4**th **September 2020**. 32 people responded, making the AGM quorate.
